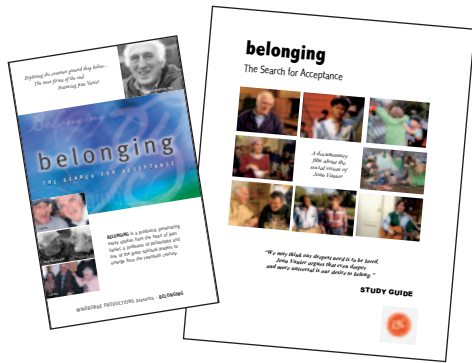


Belonging: The Search for Acceptance

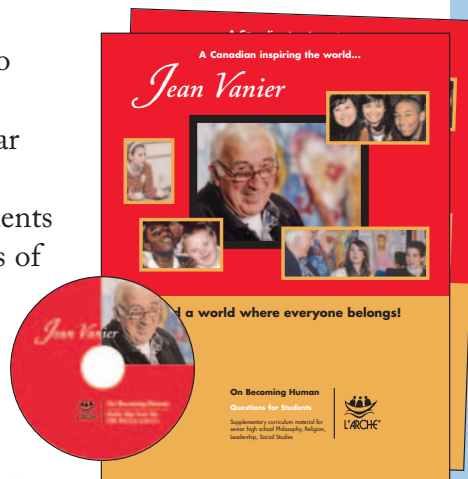
On Becoming Human
