### Dear friends,

L'Arche Canada, today, is part of a broader movement for change. Our activities, projects and priorities are a testimony to this, across all levels of the organization.

We are more than a network of communities centered around homes. We are becoming communities of belonging, with diverse initiatives and a range of living and support options that reflect the various needs and goals of each person. These include shared homes, supported or independent apartments, respite stays, and vibrant activity programs. Across L'Arche in Canada, we are seeing more community hubs, local partnerships, and creative ways of gathering and connecting.

Our funding models are evolving as well, becoming increasingly person-centred, allowing individuals to choose the supports that best fit their needs.

While part of a federation focused on supporting community life, today L'Arche Canada is expanding its mission to promote the voices of people with intellectual disabilities in broader society—an approach aligned with the vision of the new Charter adopted by communities across our global federation.

This was clearly visible at our national gathering last September, where a facilitation team that included people with intellectual disabilities led our working sessions. It was also reflected in our international presence: in New York, where we participated in the Conference of States Parties (COSP) to the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, and in Vienna, where Nick Herd and Siân Walker represented L'Arche at the Zero Project Conference. L'Arche Canada is committed to fostering leadership among people with intellectual disabilities both at home and on the world stage.

This Annual Report offers a vivid glimpse into the life of L'Arche Canada and L'Arche across the country.

L'Arche Canada is a national movement rooted in relationships and shaped by the contributions of people with intellectual disabilities. Together we seek to build a world where everyone belongs. Through shared life, mutual support, and public leadership, we work to reveal the value of people with intellectual disabilities

As part of an international federation, L'Arche Canada contributes to the global L'Arche movement by supporting 30 communities across the country with tools, guidance and advocacy. Through regional leaders, national partnerships, communications and public policy work, we help ensure that inclusion is not just lived locally but amplified nationally.

This year, we participated in 23 national partnerships with more than 60 organizations. Together, we've worked on inclusive housing, disability justice, financial access, and civic engagement. These partnerships extend L'Arche's voice into spaces where policy is shaped and barriers are broken down.

Leadership of People with Intellectual Disabilities

L'Arche is shaped every day by people with intellectual disabilities—through their voices, choices, and leadership.

This year, Nick Herd and Siân Walker represented L'Arche at the Zero Project Conference, held at the United Nations headquarters in Vienna. Nick spoke not just as a content creator and advocate, but as a mentor. "I'm here as a teacher, mentor, and coach to the younger generations like Siân," he said.

Siân shared her vision: "I'd like to see more companies taking on people with additional learning needs and helping them communicate in their own ways."

This spring, 43 house and program leaders from all eight L'Arche communities in Ontario gathered for a day of formation co-led by a person with an intellectual disability. Those who were present described it as a meaningful opportunity to reflect and grow together. Across the country, people with intellectual disabilities are stepping into leadership—hosting meetings, mentoring others, and shaping the life of their communities.

More than 350 hands-on training sessions and support days were delivered across 30 communities this year. The session with Matt and Andreas reminded me of all the amazing things we do at L'Arche, and how sharing our stories is what it's all about. I'm excited to keep learning.

# **Communities of Belonging**

In Nova Scotia, the L'Arche Atlantic communities are actively engaging with the provincial "Remedy" initiative-a community-based effort to transform how people with intellectual disabilities are supported. L'Arche Cape Breton, in particular is meeting with government officials and contributing ideas. Their leadership highlights how L'Arche can play a meaningful role in broader public conversations about inclusion, reconciliation, and systems change. As part of this work, the community is also exploring the development of four new inclusive housing units.

This spirit of belonging isn't limited to one region; it's reflected across the country. At our last national meeting in Châteauguay, an animation team of people with and without disabilities set the tone for a gathering rooted in joy, welcome and connection.

As Lorra Balagtas, an animation team member from Calgary stated, "I am happy to share my talents, and I have grown and will continue to grow with L'Arche."

Belonging isn't just about being included. It's about creating spaces where everyone's voice is heard and valued.



# National Advocacy

L'Arche Canada is helping people with intellectual disabilities to bring their voices into places where decisions are made, from government consultations to national policy. This year, L'Arche didn't just respond to change—we helped shape it.

Through the European Union-funded TWIDSA project (Together With and Without Intellectual Disabilities in Self-Advocacy), youth from four countries—including Canada—are leading public conversations about work, belonging, and equity. Canadian leaders are helping create and deliver the training.

L'Arche Canada advanced civic representation and participation of people with intellectual disabilities through partnerships with national institutions. With People First of Canada, we hosted five open-door sessions to increase awareness of the Disability Tax Credit, Registered Disability Savings Plan, and the Canada Disability Benefit. We also led bilingual workshops with Elections Canada and partnered with the Senate of Canada to review legislative materials and recommend ways to make

them more accessible.

As part of Canada's civil society report on the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD):

- We helped shape a section of Article 19, the right to live in community
- L'Arche voices ensured the report reflected lived experience

We participate in building a more just society where each person has a place.

Supporting L'Arche in Canada

L'Arche Canada's role isn't to direct communities. It's to help them thrive. We offer practical tools, coordination services and a shared mission rooted in trust and relationship.

This year, we supported 8 regional gatherings and over 100 coordination meetings. These moments—whether online or in person—build connection, share insight, and strengthen the movement.

A major focus this year was launching a new national HR system. Nearly every community is now on ADP, with 1,480+ employees registered. The transition included 15 weeks of onboarding meetings, 14 new training guides, and one-on-one support for each community.

# Global Solidarity in Action

### HOW L'ARCHE CANADA SUPPORTS THE FEDERATION

L'Arche is more than a collection of communities. It is a federation that crosses borders and languages. Our solidarity work is how we honour that bond: we walk with communities who face greater challenges and fewer resources, and we stand together in times of crisis and celebration.

In 2024, L'Arche Canada sent **\$380,199** to support solidarity initiatives across the globe. These funds, coordinated through the L'Arche Canada Foundation, helped sustain daily life, expand capacity, and strengthen resilience in L'Arche communities. From virtual prayer gatherings to cross-border training and fundraising, these relationships reflect the vision of our interdependent world.

#### Spotlight: Standing with L'Arche Haiti

L'Arche Haiti continues to navigate extreme instability, with communities in Carrefour and Chantal continuing to care for more than 60 people with intellectual disabilities under daily threats of violence, economic collapse, and displacement. L'Arche Haiti is showing remarkable resilience.

Thanks to donations coordinated through the L'Arche Canada Foundation, our partners in Haiti have been able to:

- Develop and test an emergency evacuation plan
- Stockpile food and medicine
- Reinforce security infrastructure
- Hire additional assistants
- Offer mental health and psychosocial support
- Sustain educational programs for 30 children at the Centre d'Éveil
- Continue income-generating projects through their workshop and garden


#### Consolidated L'Arche Canada and L'Arche Canada Foundation revenues


The current consolidated financial situation of L'Arche Canada at the national level
